MIDLAND CITY COUNCIL MINUTES April 09, 2019

BRIEFING SESSION

The City Council convened in a Briefing Session in the basement conference room, City Hall, Midland, Texas, at 9:30 a.m. on April 09, 2019.

Mayor Morales called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

1. Receive a project update from representatives of the Midland Downtown Park Conservancy.

Scott Kidwell provided an update on Centennial Park. He introduced Midland Downtown Park Conservancy board members present noting it is a great project. He thanked the leadership for their vision for this private/public partnership. The conservancy has been formed and they will run and oversee the park. The board has been established and has signed a construction contract with Lee Lewis and fund-raising efforts are well on their way. The board is also working with the Chamber to put somebody in place to manage the day-to-day activities of the park. When this park opens it will be great for generations to come.

Jim Rhotenberry of Rhotenberry Wellen Architects reported the construction contract has been signed with Lee Lewis who will manage the construction and is also the construction manager of the Bush Convention Center. They had their first pre-construction meeting last week with the contractor and all sub-contractors and the building permit has been issued. Of the four traffic signals surrounding the park, three will need a change of equipment or location. There are two other projects occurring in the neighborhood that will impact what they do. In the next two weeks, a lot of demolition will occur including all existing sidewalks, curb, gutter and remnants of the old Centennial Plaza. This means the fence around the perimeter will have to move outside of the curb for the contractors to do their work. They are sensitive to the need for parking downtown and will continue to work to minimize that as much as possible. Construction will take about one year. There will be some blockages on Wall Street, but staff will be notified in advance. Another sensitive item is tree removal.

There will be about ½ dozen trees that will be saved, but some of the other trees are diseased or planted in a way that does not allow them to be transplanted. Over 100 new trees will be planted over the next year.

He reviewed the construction schedule milestones including demolition, tree protection, underground utility installation, water feature vaults construction and underground cistern installation. Building foundations will begin in July and building construction of stages will begin in August or September. Landscaping will go in next February and March and the park will open in April of 2020. He reported on construction costs noting no cuts have been made to the design which includes a splash pad, stage, restrooms, shade structures, and a dog park. One key feature is the media mesh screen that sits adjacent to the stage. The funding for that screen was transferred to the Bush Convention Center project and the price remains the same even though structure and aspect ratio was changed. The screen will be 20 feet tall, 26 feet long and 15 feet off the ground. The stage cover is fixed and there is a portable stage that stores next to the stage making the stage cover a big umbrella. There will be parking along Wall and Texas for food trucks.

Council Member Hotchkiss thanked Mr. Rhotenberry for the extreme design enhancements that were done that will conserve and utilize water on the property. It is a lot more work, but the net result is healthier trees and less water usage from City water.

The foregoing agenda items were discussed by the City Council with no formal action taken. The Briefing Session was adjourned at 9:46 a.m.

Council Member Love invited James Beauchamp forward to give more information on the topic.

James Beauchamp reported the resolution supports the extension of I-27 but felt it should specifically say the extension of the I-27 to the Midland Odessa area. He provided background to how interstates can be designated. The Texas Transportation Commission has been clear that they will not designate or support a multi-route designation. He felt that the designation all the way to Laredo would mean the segment would go through Big Spring instead of the Midland Odessa area. He suggested that instead Midland support the designation of I-27 from Lubbock to Midland which would cost less and would be more likely to be designated.

City Attorney John Ohnemiller clarified that the current resolution mirrors what was adopted by the MDC and it would be prudent to have the MDC go back to make their support clearer prior to Council taking action.

Development Services Director Chuck Harrington gave a brief overview of the item noting it is a request to add the sale of alcoholic beverages with the hours of alcoholic

service Tuesday through Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. and Sunday from 12:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. The item has been reviewed by all departments with no comments. It is in compliance with the comprehensive plan, meets all requirements and staff recommends approval.

Traffic Engineer Mike Pacelli gave a brief overview of the item noting this is a traffic ordinance for a work zone. The Texas Department of Transportation is starting construction on I-20 and Midkiff sometime in 2020. Staff recommends approval.

Council Member Love explained that this is the first of several we will see next year because the plan for I-20 requires the interstate to go over the exit roads instead of under due to the number of trucks hitting the bridges.

Points earned can be redeemed at local businesses around town. Mayor Morales asked her to get with the Public Information Office to help get this competition publicized.
